I called you Friday, regarding this matter I am writing about. My father, Harry Rosenberg, was interred in Los Angeles in 1952. There was no money to ship his body to Chicago. I asked if you could sell his plot which was purchased in 1938 at the time my mother, Elizabeth Rosenberg, was interred in Temple Emanuel at Waldheim.

You indicated it would be almost futile to sell this plot, therefore I suggested the plot be transferred to my brother's name, Charles Rosenberg.

Is it possible, that if + when my brother dies, the plot would be his. We cannot find the deed of the transaction, but I'm sure you must have a record of the transaction.
